HISTORY	<p>CFS began serving members of Christian Fellowship Church in 1981. The initial enrollment of 24 students has grown to approximately 290 students in Preschool through 12th grade. Because of the overall success of the school program and the need in the Mid-Missouri area for Christian education, CFS opened its doors to the Mid-Missouri Christian community in August of 1992. Today, CFS students come from a variety of non-denominational and denominational backgrounds, including Baptist, Lutheran, Disciples of Christ, Evangelical Free and Assembly of God.</p>
MISSION STATEMENT	<p>The mission of Christian Fellowship School is to provide quality Christian education in a community of grace where students are known and loved.</p>
CURRICULUM	<p>CFS utilizes the Splash into PreK curriculum in Preschool and ABeka, Purposeful Design, and BJU Press curriculum in elementary grades K - 5. Art, music, PE, chapel, band, library and computer skills classes supplement the elementary curriculum.</p> <p>CFS Middle and High School uses Christian textbooks from BJU Press and ABeka, with some secular texts to support its educational objectives. Course work includes American and British Literature, Grammar, Vocabulary, Reading, Poetry, Composition I and II, Drama, Creative Writing, Algebra I and II, Geometry, College Algebra, Analytical Geometry & Trigonometry, Statistics, Calculus, Life Science, Earth Science, Physics, Chemistry, Biology, Anatomy & Physiology, Science & Society, Geography, World History, U.S. History, American Government, Psychology, Spanish I and II, Drawing, Painting, Advanced Art, Band, Choir, Intro to Technology, Advanced Technology, Yearbook, Personal Finance, Health, PE, and Bible 7-12. Dual credit classes offered include College Algebra, Analytical Geometry & Trigonometry, Statistics, Calculus, New Testament, Old Testament, and English Composition I and II. Additional course work is available through independent study, including a variety of languages other than Spanish and Spanish III and IV. Upper-level students have access to numerous elective career and technical courses through a sending school agreement with the Columbia Area Career Center.</p>
ACTIVITIES	<p>Boys' soccer (Fall), girls' volleyball (Fall), boys and girls cross country (Fall) and basketball (Winter), girls soccer (Spring), coed track (Spring) and boys baseball (Spring) teams compete with other Christian high school teams in the state of Missouri. There are also varsity and junior varsity cheerleading squads. Academic and Fine Art competitions are coordinated through the Association of Christian Schools International (ACSI). High school students may also participate in drama club, National Honor Society and Student Council.</p>
SCHOOL UNIFORM	<p>Students in grades K-5 and 6-8 wear a school uniform, with the uniform options varied by age and gender. For a complete description of the CFS uniform options, please review a copy of the uniform code in the school office, or on the school website.</p>
DRESS CODE	<p>High school students in grades 9-12 do not wear a school uniform but follow a high school dress code.</p>
ACT SCORES	<p>The average ACT composite score for CFS graduating seniors over the past 5 years is 24.0. The National and State averages are 20.6 and 20.6, respectively.</p>
AFFILIATIONS	<p>CFS is a member of the Association of Christian Schools International (ACSI) and Oral Roberts University Educational Fellowship (ORUEF). CFS is accredited by both the International Christian Accrediting Association (ICAA) and Cognia (formerly AdvancED).</p>

Tuition Payment Options: Tuition may be paid using any one of the following four options:

- **Annual Payment Option** - A single payment of total tuition for the year will be automatically withdrawn on August 1st. There is an additional 2% discount for payment with the annual payment option.
- **Semi-Annual Payment Option** - Two payments, (each 1/2 of the total yearly tuition) with the first payment withdrawn on August 1st and the second payment withdrawn on December 1st. There is an additional 1% discount with the semi-annual option.
- **Monthly Payment Option** - Ten payments (1 per month, August – May, each equaling 1/10 of the total yearly tuition) will be automatically withdrawn on either the 5th **OR** the 20th of each month, with the date selected by the family.
- **Semi-Monthly Payment Option** - Twenty payments (2 per month, August – May, each equaling 1/20 of the total yearly tuition) will be automatically withdrawn on the 5th **AND** the 20th of each month.

Application Fee: Families wishing to apply for admission of students to CFS (Preschool - 12) must pay an Application Fee of \$50.00 per student, which is non-refundable. This fee is due at the time the online application is submitted.

Enrollment Fees: An initial non-refundable enrollment fee of \$150.00 per child is due upon acceptance for admission to CFS for students who are enrolling for the first time in Preschool through 12th grade.

Out-of-State Class Trip Fees: When CFS students are in grades 8,11, and 12, they get to participate in special out-of-state, class trips that provide unique educational, service/historical, and recreational experiences. Students in 5th, 6th, 7th grade are assessed a \$50 fee per student annually to go toward the Creation Museum trip in 8th grade. Students in 8th -12th grade are assessed a \$100 per student fee annually to go toward the junior service/historical trip and recreational trip. These fees are due August 1st, and they are non-refundable.
